GED Test Schedule
FALL 2009

GED

Purpose: Allows adults who have not graduated from high school the opportunity to earn a high school diploma.

Registration is required before individuals may take the GED Test. All candidates should appear in person with proper documentation at the A.G. Gaston Auditorium at 9o'clock a.m. Registration is on a first come, first serve basis.

Candidates who are planning to test for the first time must:

1. Pre-pay the required fee (\$50.00 for first time examinees) in the Business Office. Located in the Administration Building (2nd floor). Individuals who are retaking the examination must pay \$10.00 for each exam. Candidates who are retaking the examination must pay \$10.00 for each exam.
2. All applicants must present their U.S. Social Security Number (SSAN) that will be used in all record keeping systems for the purpose of identification verification. You must also present to the GED Examiner a valid government identification card that includes your photograph, legal name, birth date, address, and signature. A current identification card issued by a member institution of the Alabama College System is also acceptable as long as your photograph, name, birth date, address, and signature are included. Expired or altered identification documents are not acceptable.
3. Bring receipt, proper identification to the Leon Kennedy Student Center Room 221.

Registration for the GED examination begins promptly at 10:00 a.m. and will take about 2 1/2 hours to complete. Individuals who do not attend the registration session **will not** be permitted to take the test on the date given.

4. Pay \$10.00 for each exam
